# Checklist for little Heroes

4-6 months before	dates set & time blocked around and after those dates, take time off, maybe create your own potty calendar
	say goodbye to night time feeding and bedtime meals in time
	"Once we get rid of the nappy! Haha! That'll be great!"
	Get 2-3 children's books on the topic of potty training and gradually start reading them to your child (not all at once!). In the end, your child will decide which book he or she wants to read over and over again.
	buy a potty
	"Once we get rid of the nappy! Haha! That'll be great!" complemented by the question "And do you know what we'll do then? Buy knickers!"
	Plan for or include siblings.  Recruit help for emergencies and/or training support.
1 month before	Start talking about what kind of undies your child would love to have. Always end with the sentence "Well we'll see what's available and YOU choose!
	For the sticker charts: either paper and crayons or print out your pick from the sample charts. either print out stickers on sticker paper or buy different sticker sheets.
	buy & wash molton underpads
	4 to 6 small gifts (mini colouring book, mini books to read on the toilet, a Lego figure, or the likes)
	2 to 3 larger gifts (a doll, a car that can do something, a dinosaur)
2 weeks before	Shopping: stock up on daily needs and hygiene articles, food, drinks
	Pre-cook and freeze food or otherwise prepare meals.
Count Down last we	"You know what we're doing next week / in a few days / tomorrow? Potty training! Yeahh! Are you ready?", "Tomorrow we'll go buy undies! And we'll wash them and then we'll do potty training the next day!".
	Last-minute errands. You will be housebound for a couple of days.
1 day before	Go buy undies together. (cut out the labels!!)
	Wash and dry undies together.
	Make beds and put on molton pads.
	Prepare everything (wet wipes, pants, paper and pens, stickers, presents)
Go Crazy Happy	In the evening, go over the "Three Days Awake Chapter" again and take a deep breath!
